FILES, FILES, AND MORE FILES!

In 2005, Oklahoma Farmers Union (now named American Farm and Rancher's Mutual Insurance) bought a historical building in downtown Oklahoma City for their corporate headquarters. Although nothing was allowed to change on the outside of the building, the inside of this gracious five story building had to fit the needs of 300 employees and countless paper files. Having partnered with Core Office Furniture salesman Don Cox since 2000, they asked him to proceed in planning a complete furniture and filing package for the new space.



OFU had countless sections of shelving with no real filing plan in mind. Their need for organized filing was huge! Luckily there was plenty of space in the new headquarters to handle current filing needs and allow for future growth in an organized and efficient manner. According to Don Cox, Bob Ragland of Buddy Brown & Associates (our Mayline Representative), Mayline Space Planning, and the Kwik-File staff were there every step of the way verifying floor loads, refining the layout and drawings and orchestrating the smooth delivery and installation.



The project consisted of five separate large Mobile Aisle high density systems, each 7 tiers high and approximately 30' x 17' in size, with a work area in the center of the total storage area. This project which totaled about \$300,000 list was unique for Core Office as each section was as large as any one system that they had ever done. All filing was centralized for easy access by all employees, increasing their efficiency by being able to find files quickly and easily in one area.
